

TERMS & CONDITIONS

Items more than 100 years old cannot be taken out of India without the permission of the Director General, Archaeological Survey of India, New Delhi -110001

- 1. The auction is conducted in Indian Rupees.
- The winning bidder is the buyer of the lot.
- 3. The auctioneer has the right to divide, combine or withdraw lots from the auction without giving any reason. The bidding is totally regulated by the auctioneer. The auctioneer has full right to refuse any bid or bidder.
- 4. The estimate figures presented after each lot are the auctioneer's estimated price and no bids below that will be considered.
- 5. We do not subscribe to the theory of hidden or undeclared reserve prices. Our auctions are totally transparent without any such reserves. Hence, the estimate price of each item is the genuine starting price.
- 6. Each bidder has to register for the auction and will therefore be required to fill up a registration form with full address, telephone number and email id. Each bidder form has to be signed by the bidder. By filling up the form, the bidder shall be deemed to have undertaken to fulfill all conditions of the Auction. By making a bid, each buyer acknowledges his acceptance of these conditions and shall be bound by them
- 7. Those bidders who are new to the auctioneer may be required to furnish 24 hours prior to the auction either or all of the following: trade references; refundable deposit or identity proof.
- 8. While registered bidders who have fulfilled condition 7 are free to bid in person, postal or email Buy bids will only be accepted from bidders who are well known to the auctioneer.
- 9. All winning bidders have to pay for their winning bid/purchase within 3 working days of closure of auction. For lots paid after 3 days, the auctioneer reserves the right of charging 3% monthly interest on any overdue payment or cancel the purchase.
- 10. Delivery shall only be made against full payment.
- 11. Any charges incurred in receiving payment, credit card charges, etc. have to be borne by the buyer.
- 12. It is strongly recommended by the auctioneer that if the buyer or bidder is present in person, he/she should carefully inspect every lot before bidding on it. Even when not present, the Buyers or bidders have to satisfy themselves regarding the accuracy of their purchase, that is, the lot they are bidding on.
- 13. Before making payment and taking delivery of their purchase, buyers must inspect their purchase, the auctioneer is not responsible for any discrepancy discovered after the delivery of the lots have been taken by the buyer.
- 14. Extension for certification is possible but the entire process should not take more than four months from the date of the auction and the bidder/buyer has followed the procedure laid down in Term and Condition No. 15. However, such extension is not possible in any lots that have multiple, that is, more than one unit. Similarly, such extension is not possible for any lot already accompanied by a certificate.
- 15. Any extension for certification is only possible in the following steps: Prior permission is taken by the bidder at least ten working days before the auction and complete payment is made by the winning bidder/buyer who has taken prior permission. Once the complete payment is received, the lot shall be handed over to the buyer, that is, the entire certification process is the responsibility of the buyer and the auctioneer or vendor are not responsible in any way. All requisite permission and legal requirements to aid the certification process are the sole responsibility of the buyer. Also, only certification by Royal Philatelic Society, London or British Philatelic Association, UK, is accepted. If the item is found to be NOT genuine, the buyer can return the item to the auctioneer in its original state. Any damaged or altered item shall not be accepted as returned. The item shall then be returned to the auctioneer and the buyer will receive a full refund within 14 working days of receipt of return.
- 16. The auctioneer is solely an agent and shall not be responsible for any default by either buyer or seller or for any action that may arise in respect of any law.
- 17. The auctioneer is solely an agent and hence not the owner of any of the items being auctioned nor are the items in his possession. Transfer of ownership of any items in the auction catalogue only occurs if the goods are actually sold, that is, when payment is received.
- 18. In the event of non-payment of any dispute, the auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to determine the dispute or resell the disputed lot
- 19. All Lots in the auction are shown by either images and/or complete description. Neither the auctioneer nor the vendor/seller is responsible for any error in the description. All statements as to the items being sold regarding condition, state, colour, catalogue references are statements of opinion only and the auctioneer is not responsible for any discrepancy in the same. The auctioneer reserves the right in forming his opinion or to consult and rely upon any expert or specialist regarded by the auctioneer as reliable.
- 20. For items that are shown by images, the images are part of the description and should take precedence over the written description. Bidders have to themselves satisfy themselves regarding the condition/state of their purchase. On the request of bidders, the auctioneer is willing to provide images/scans of reverse of items where back scans are not shown in the website or the catalogue.
- The buyer has to pay any shipping and handling charges that are incurred. We shall only ship by either Express Mail Service of India Post or reputed courier services.
- 22. Each lot shall be at the buyer's risk after the fall of the auctioneer's hammer.

 Bid increments shall be as follows: 0 to 1,999 Rs. 250; 2,000 to 9,999 Rs. 500; 10,000 to 49,999 Rs. 1,000; 50,000 to 99,999 Rs. 5,000; 100,000 to 999,999 Rs. 10,000; 999,999 onwards Rs. 20,000
- 23. A Buyer's Premium of 11.8% shall be charged on the hammer price, this is inclusive of Goods and Services Tax on Buyer's Premium which is 18%. Over and above the Buyer's Premium, the Buyer shall have to pay the Goods and Services Tax on Philatelic Items which is 5%. As an example: an item sold at a hammer price of Rs. 1,000 shall be charged Buyer Premium of Rs. 100, added to it will be GST @18% that is Rs. 18. GST on the Philatelic Item of Rs. 1,000 shall be Rs. 50. The Buyer will hence pay Rs. 1,168 on a hammer price of Rs. 1,000.
- 24. Courts of Delhi shall have exclusive jurisdiction in all matters pertaining to this Auction.

 Agra Service 1852 Soldier's mail to Ireland – part entire signed by commanding officer. Clear strike of Agra Giles#15 in Black, Giles only records this strike in Red.

Bengal GPO Post Paid 1806 to London

 lovely early example of Giles#SD2. Red
 London arrival cds. Superb.

₹10,000

 INDI strike on entire from Calcutta to London – Calcutta GPO Giles#G18 clear mark along with London arrival postmark.
 A of India Missing variety in Superb and Scarce entire that displays beautifully.

4. Calcutta Paid and Receiving House on entire — Giles#24 on native cover with what appears to be an official seal. Worm holes on entire that surprising do not mar the appearance. Additionally struck by Calcutta Giles#X14 with error of inverted 'u' in the word House. Scarcely seen.

Calcutta General Post Office and India
 Letter Portsmouth strikes –
 Giles#SD8b on 1826 entire to England.
 Superb.

6. Calcutta Ship Letter Redirected Entire
1837 – Receipt Giles#42a single weight
clear strike that was struck out by hand
and Calcutta Paid 6 annas was applied.
Addressed to an employee of the Bengal
Engineers with Dwarkanath Tagore's Carr
Tagore& Co. Redirected to Hazareebaug.
Scarce and Very desirable.

7. Cawnpore to Lucknow 1843 entire – superb strike of Cawnpore Giles#9 and additional strike of what is most likely Lucknow Giles#10.

8. **Delhie Receiving House 2 entires** - bearing 2 annas and 4 annas. Ageing marks and faults as found on native entires.

9. Dera Ismail Khan 1852 to London – not recorded by Giles. 15 annas paid cover to London. Giles records the post office but did not have an example. Ageing marks and other blemishes do not detract from this rarity. Possibly Unique.

10. Dinapore Paid 1849 to England – very fine entire with clear strike of Dinapore Giles#9 and blue Beford delivery cds. Oval India strike on front.

Elichpoor Post Paid on entire to Jaulnah – the Elichpoor strike recorded by Giles in his supplement. The stamp tied by Type 4/79/Elichpoor Camp. Additionally franked by 1856 Jaulnah Giles#5. Very Scarce.

Gujranwala Bearing to Simla via Lahore 1852 – Gujranwala Giles#1 with fine strike of Lahore Giles#7 which according to Giles was a military handover to civil P.O. mark. On arrival at Simla struck by Giles#8 in red.

₹9,000

Hingolee Bearing to Madras 1843 – Not recorded by Giles. Written from Sunkerumpetta on 1 January and posted in Hingolee on 23 January, the distance between these places is about 900 kilometres! On arrival struck by superb example of Madras Giles#MX5. Rarity.

Jansi Paid 1850 entire – not recorded by Giles. 1.5 annas paid along with manuscript Agent Gov General Camp. Historically significant as in the years leading to the First War of Independence in 1857, the kingdom of Jansi (Jhansi) was in a constant state of tension with the East India Company.

₹6,000

Jubbulpore Paid to Saugor 1838 – from the personal collection of Giles and illustrated in his book on Page 109. Fine strike of Giles#3 and with original contents that have been typed out.

Jhujjer Bearing 1853 cover - fantastic discovery of a Punjab Circle post office and postmark not far from Delhi. Giles does not record this post office and hence had no example to show. Major Discovery.

Khamgaum Paid unrecorded by Giles on entire - half anna 1854 cancelled by very scarce Type4a/71/Khamgaum, additionally struck with Jaulnah Giles#5. Crease and other faults do not detract from this new discovery.

Kotah Two line Handstruck postage 18. **stamp** – on part entire. The two line type similar to other postmarks from the early 1850s but Kotahnot recorded by Giles.

₹8,000

Kussowlee Post Paid 1844 on entire to 19. Ireland – Giles#1 used in 1844 which is earlier than the postmark recorded by Giles. Very Scarce.

₹12,000

Lucknow Bearing Unrecorded Type 1853 - addressed to Cawnpore. The Lucknow strike with crude, uneven and mishappen alphabets creating a new unrecorded handstruck postage stamp that is not recorded by Giles. With partial Cawnpore strike. Ageing marks and other faults do not detract from this rare discovery.

21. Madras Ship Letter and India Letter Portsmouth strikes – Giles#SD13 on 1830 entire to London along with red delivery cds. Superb.

₹3,000

22. Madras 1845 entire in combination with GB Red Penny – superb strike of Madras Giles#SD21 on entire diverted from Strand to Hyde Park. Fascinating combination with a GB Stamp on an Indian origin entire from 1844 when postage stamps were still not issued in India. Very low start as such early combination entires have sold for record prices.

Pare entire via Calcutta and Madras to Madeira — letter originates from Molamyne (most likely Moulmein in Burma). Variety of postmarks including Madras Giles#15 Post Not Paid, Madras Ship Letter Giles#SD11 and Giles#13 and Madras Giles#MX4. Redirected from Madeira to London. Transit strikes including India Letter Plymouth. Fascinatingly routed cover. Exhibit Showpiece.

24. Meerut to Madeira via Calcutta 1844 – strike of Meerut Paid in Red. In Calcutta various strikes were added: Calcutta Ship Letter, boxed GPO and AM strikes. Ship Letter Plymouth applied in England along with the very scarce Detained for Postage marking that is rarely found on mail originating from India.

25. Calcutta to Muttra Bearing Giles#5 – redirected to Meerut and struck by Giles#11a, from there redirected to Simla. Handwritten correction to bearing amount from 2annas to 8annas. Interesting and Scarce.

26. Mhow Paid 1838 entire to Kanhpoor – which is fact closer to the original medieval name of the city, Kanhapur, which was then spelt Cawnpore and is now spelt Kanpur. Superb strike of Mhow Giles#5.

₹7,000

27. Mungelpore Bearing Not recorded by Giles – rare strike on entire to Calcutta. This post office is recorded as being part of the Bengal circle and is in Balasore, Odisha. Rare discovery from the Bengal circle.

28. Nyneetal Paid May 1854 to London – superb strike of Giles#1. An interesting Type that has double line below the name of the station. Scarce.



29. **Pashawar Bearing 1851 on entire** – superb strike of Giles#5. Scarce.

30. Meerut to Roorkee April 1854 entire – addressed to a military officer at Camp Roorkee. Clear strike of Meerut Giles#15 along with a Roorkee paid two line strike that is not recorded by Giles. Rare discovery.

Rajpootana Bearing from Calcutta to Beaur Mhairwara 1834 – struck by Calcutta Giles#16 and Giles#G9. And Rajpootana Bearing Giles#5. Addressed to Lt. Colonel Henry Hall, who led the Mhair Military Campaign in the Ajmere-Mhairwarrah region. Hall went on to administer the region and raise a corps of Mhairs for the East India Company.

Sadras Paid to Madras – fine strike of the very scarce Sadras Giles#2 alongwith Madras GPO and AM postmarks.

₹7,000

Simla Paid 1845 to England – clear strike of Giles#3 with transit and delivery cds in Red and Green. Intact seal that reads 'Never Repine'! Exhibit quality.

₹6.000

Surat Bearing 1844 on entire – mounting marks on reverse with complete entire. Surat Giles#4 dated 31-7-44 bearing 4 annas.

₹4,000

Wuzeerabad Bearing 1850 to Loodianah – superb strike of Giles#3 in Black. Scarce Punjab circle post office.

SCINDE DAWK AND 1854 ISSUES

Blue Scinde Dawk SG#S2 very fine used - cut round with clear margins on all sides. Closed minor 3.5mm tear does not

detract as the stamp is in lovely blue colour. Lightly cancelled and with Sismondo 2009 Certificate. Very Desirable as most examples are soiled and toned.

Half Anna Showpiece Die I Block of 12 marginal - with Corner Ornaments. Stamps with toned reverse and creases as are to be expected in such a large block. Positions 5, 6, 7, 8/13, 14, 15, 16/21, 22, 23, 24. Bottom part of the margin below the stamps has been reattached and reinforced with taping. None of the faults detract from the exhibit quality of this block. Such multiples of Die I are rarely seen or offered.

Half Anna Die I Pale Blue Mint displaying part of the watermark and hence can be used for sheet reconstruction. Fine margins.

39. Half Anna Die I Blue Mint – fine margins but toned slightly toned condition.

Die I Lot of 7 very fine used – each stamp 40. with good to excellent margins. In all shades of this Die.

Half Anna Group 6 Retouch on entire rare and majorly retouched stamp on entire to Russelkonda in Ganjam district of Bengal circle. Madras Paid and Nowgaum Paid handstruck stamps on reverse. Nicks and minor faults on entire do not detract from this magnificent early November 1854 usage.

Half Anna on cover from Murree to Rawalpindi - roughly opened from reverse. Murree transit and Rawalpindi delivery cds. Retouch in hair band.

Half Anna Die I used on cover from Calcutta to Bombay – Calcutta Zuber and Co. forwarding agents chop on reverse along with Calcutta transit and Bombay GPO postmarks.

Half Anna Die I cover from Nagpore to Calcutta – superb pair of Die I tied by Type 4/75/Nagpore along with Giles#3. Slightly reduced on one side but that does not detract from this superbly franked cover.

8.5 annas rate to Prussia – 4 Two annas and 1 Half Anna each cancelled by Diamond of Dots cancellation on piece to Prussia. On cut out, certified as genuine by BPA in 2024. Very Desirable.

One Anna Die I cover from Agra to Calcutta – stamp tied by Type 5 Numeral 1 of Agra. Calcutta delivery postmark on reverse. Couple of pinholes and other faults do not detract. Scarce.

1 anna Die I cover from Mominabad to **London 1855** – some paper loss on upper right side. Additionally struck by Mominabad Giles#1 in purple, Bombay transit and London receiving postmarks.

Four Annas used on cover from 61. Bolarum via Madras to England -Madras transit cds on reverse and London delivery cds plus India Paid on front. Scarce and very fine.

₹30.000

Four Annas Second Printing Pair on 62. entire - to Bordeaux France. Struck by chop of Graf &Banzinger Calcutta and other transit and delivery postmarks. The pair itself has been identified by the collector as Position 9-10. Minor paper loss and blemishes do not detract from this Showpiece. Rare and Very Desirable.

83. East India 2 annas Yellow Buff Mint SG#42 – mint with part original gum. Superb example of this 'difficult' stamp. Catalogues at above Rs. 1,20,000. Very low start for this rare stamp.

84. **East India 8pies Marginal block of 4** – some ageing marks but large part original white gum. Very fine block of SG#52 that catalogues at around Rs. 40,000.

85. KGV 1922 Surcharge Variety Slanting

Serif – in horizontal pair with regular
stamp. SG#195c in mounted mint
condition with large part slightly toned
gum. Very low start.

86. **Airmail 3 annas Q variety** – the variety on the alphabet partially hidden behind the postmark's ornament. However, the variety is also established by the broken lines below the alphabet. Hence, a clear and very fine used example of SG#221a.

flight cover that went from Calcutta to
Singapore. Listed Stanley Gibbons
